Notes:

- GDP numbers are from Wikipedia table from "List of countries by GDP (PPP)" and "List of countries by GDP (nominal)". Data is from IMF for 2008.
- Purchasing Power Parity (PPP) GDP accounts for the relative effective domestic purchasing power of the average producer or consumer within an economy. It is a better indicator for the propensity of businesses to purchase software in the local currency.
- Nominal GDP converts the value of goods and services using a global currency exchange rates at a fixed rate in time.
- Populations are from Wikipedia table from "List of countries by population." Most are from UN estimates and there is some variation in dates. USA is an estimate of 1 Jan 2009
- Excludes Caribbean countries
